Following her second retirement, Jayne still applies her gardening interests in her own large garden and assisting a friend in a horticultural business. In a busy life, among her other interests, she lists needle work (cross-stitch and petit point), tai-chi and attending the gym. On a broader scale, Jayne has been a member of Landcare Tasmania for 30 years, currently undertaking the roles of Secretary and Coordinator of West Tamar Landcare.

Jayne's interest in family history started about 10 years ago when she attended an information session held at the Exeter Community Centre followed later by a bus trip to Oatlands conducted by TFHS, Launceston Branch. Jaynes' Tasmanian connections go back to the early 1830s and the first of her four convict ancestors, Elizabeth Brown. With the help of other members Jayne started to chip away at her own mystery ancestor – her maternal grand-father. As a new member, her interests were listed in Tasmanian Ancestry where members again helped her with family information even connecting her with a previously unknown cousin in England who subsequently has visited Tasmania. By this stage Jayne was well and truly hooked on family history so enthusiastically joined the initial intake of The Diploma of Family History offered by the University of Tasmania, graduating in 2018. Jayne enjoyed the course and thoroughly recommends it for anyone thinking about that challenge. Jayne puts that knowledge and skills to good use assisting in the library and helping the research team when required.

The highlight for Jayne this year has been her overseas trip where she spent time with her English cousin, meeting his family and travelling around to various family landmarks. Unexpectedly finding a group of ancestral graves was the cherry on the cake.

Did you Know?

Online digital libraries can be a useful resource in tracking down ancestors as more and more printed material, previously only available on library shelves, is scanned and indexed. People may be familiar with general online digital libraries e.g. Hathitrust (https://www.hathitrust.org/) and the Internet archive (https://archive.org/) but the free site, FamilySearch's international genealogy library collection is being digitised and made accessible to family historians (https://www.familysearch.org/library/books/).

There seems to be a concentration on older, often rare, out-of-print books available, which are often the ones you can no longer find in conventional libraries. The FamilySearch search tools are user-friendly and display well on a laptop or desktop.

After signing in on FamilySearch https://www.familysearch.org/en/australia/ choose 'Search', 'Books' and then enter a name, place or keyword to get started. Source: Whodoyouthinkyouaremagazine.com, Issue 197, November 2022


